Name of Event: AMA Speedway National Best Pairs Championship
Sanction: The series is sanctioned by the American Motorcyclist Association
Rules and governance: 2020 AMA Racing Rulebook and these Supplementary Regulations govern the competition. The AMA reserves the right to modify and reissue these Supplementary Regulations as necessary.

Purse: $\quad \$ 3,500$ (as per AMA rulebook)

Officials: Each event will be run according to the 2020 AMA Racing rulebook and these Supplemental Regulations. The overall running of the meeting and decisions regarding such matters as postponement, or any matter not covered in writing will be decided on the day between the event advisory group consisting of the promoter or his named clerk of the course, AMA representative and referee. The Event Referee is the sole person responsible for receiving and deciding on all protests.

Publicity: All riders will be provided with official AMA decals that must be displayed on their helmet and motorcycle beginning with the rider parade and throughout the program, including victory podium celebration.

Fork Covers: Riders retain exclusive right to advertising on their machines, including the fork covers.

Fuel: Riders will provide their own fuel that must comply with current rulebook.
Tires: Any approved speedway tire in 2020 AMA rulebook is allowed
Substance Abuse Policy: Compliance with the AMA's Substance Abuse Policy is an essential precondition to competition. Random tests for prohibited substances may be conducted at the discretion of AMA Racing.

Fees: Riders pay $\$ 15$ gate free plus $\$ 25$ entry fee. Mechanics pay $\$ 20$ gate fee.

## AMA Speedway National Best Pairs Race Format:

Competition for individual riders: 7 teams compete in five rounds of competition, meeting each opposing team one time. The top two teams on points compete in a sudden death final to decide the championship.

All heats will be run with a maximum of 4 riders over 4 laps.
Heats 1-21 Score 3,2,1,0. Non-finish = 0.
Final Score 4,3,2,0.
Points do not carry to Sudden Death final. It is the result of this heat that determines the event winner.

The team with the most points scored in the final wins the championship. Points from heats do not carry to the final. High scoring team from the heats has gate choices (1 \& 3 or 2 \& 4) for Final.

Teams entered will draw for a position. Teams may choose which rider takes which gate in from their allocated gates in each race.

## Tie Breakers:

In the event of two teams being tied in the final classification of points, tiebreakers are as follows;

1. Number of bonus points
2. Number of heat winners
3. Number of second places
4. Number of third places
5. Number of finishes fourth places
6. Number of non-finishing $4^{\text {th }}$ places
7. Head to head results between tied teams (A 3-3 is determined the team finishing $2^{\text {nd }} \& 3^{\text {rd }}$ beats $1^{\text {st }}$ and $2^{\text {nd }}$ ).

In the event the competition does not complete all races due to weather or other logistical matters, a result can be declared upon the conclusion of Heat 14 or Heat 21. For example, if the event were abandoned after 16 races, the result would be determined upon completion of Heat 14, where all riders had completed 4 rounds.

In the event of an injury or withdrawal during the event, a reserve rider from the published list can be drafted in. In event all reserves have been used, any other rider registered at the track that day from the Division Two program can be drafted in. In event of a team withdrawal, the named reserves would ride as a team for the rest of the program.

## Prize Money.

Prize money for final finishing positions. Money is split between teammates based off individual points they score (including bonus points).

## Example.

1. The second-place team make $\$ 800$.
2. Rider A scores 12 points, ride $\mathbf{B}$ scores $7+1$.
3. That makes 20 points for the team.
4. We divide $\$ 800$ by the $\mathbf{2 0}$ points and that gives $\$ 40$ per rider per point.
5. Rider $A$ is paid $12 \times 40=\$ 480$. Rider $B$ is paid $8 \times 40=\$ 320$.
